While here, students also learn about the telecommunications industry, as well as the regulatory and legislative processes. Educational sessions on these topics are greatly enhanced by both site visits to the U.S. Capitol and the U.S. Department of Agriculture, in addition to meetings with industry leaders and members of Congress.

The students also are given ample time to explore the Nation's Capital and its many attractions. While here, the group visits such sites as the Lincoln and Jefferson Memorials; the Korean, Vietnam and World War II Memorials; Mount Vernon, home of George Washington; the Smithsonian Museums; and, much more.

#### **Black Cherry Cake**

#### Cake:

1 package white cake mix

1 1/4 cups water

1/3 cup canola oil

4 egg whites

6 ounces fat-free black cherry yogurt

#### Frosting:

6 ounces fat-free black cherry yogurt 1 carton (8 ounces) whipped topping

#### Instructions:

In large mixing bowl, combine cake mix, water, oil, and egg whites just until moistened. Beat on low speed for 2 minutes. Fold in 6 ounces of yogurt. Pour into 13 X 9 baking pan coated with non stick spray. Bake at 350° for 30-35 minutes. Cool.

Mix rest of yogurt with whipped topping and spread over cake. Store in refrigerator.
