**Call** before you dig.

## Call One Call System Before You Dig

If you have an outside project in your plans before summer ends and it requires digging, do yourself a favor and call the One Call System first. Now, you can reach One-Call System by dialing '8-1-1' from any landline phone or any cell phone that is connected to a tower in North Carolina. And, our Shady Valley and Mountain City customers also can contact the Tennessee One-Call Center by dialing 8-1-1 from their homes or businesses. When you contact the One-Call System, you will need to provide the following information:

- County and town
- Location of work street address
- Nearest cross street
- Area to be marked
- Date and time of excavation or digging
- Type of work
- Your name and number or the contractor's contact info

If you don't call first, you may end up with environmental damage, interruption of service, job or project delays or the potential for accidents and injuries. When you contact One Call first, our personnel will come and mark the utility lines in your work area. You can then dig safely without the fear of damaging telephone lines.

Enjoy the remainder of your gardening and landscaping projects this summer, but remember to be safe and the One Call System before you dig.

## **SkyLine By-Laws Summarized for Director Elections at Annual Meeting**

Due to the prevalence and continued risks associated with the COVID-19 Pandemic, SkyLine's 64th Annual Meeting will be conducted on Tuesday, October 6, at SkyLine's corporate office campus. The three-year terms of the following directors will expire as of this meeting: Sharon Kasel (Ashe); Bill Burleson (Avery); and Thomas J. McNeil (Watauga).

A summary of SkyLine Membership Corporation's By-Laws pertaining to director qualifications and nominations is provided below (Article IV, Section 4).

## Section 4.3 – Qualifications to be Nominated, to Become, or Remain a Director

Any member shall be eligible to be nominated, elected and remain a director of the Cooperative who:

- Is a natural person and a full-time legal resident, residing in the geographical area for which the person desires to serve as a Director.
- Is NOT an employee, present or former, of the Cooperative and is not in any way employed by or have a direct pecuniary interest in a competing enterprise or a business engaged in selling communication services or communication supplies or constructing or maintaining communication facilities,
- 3. Is NOT a "close relative" to an incumbent director or a present or former employee of the Cooperative. As used here "close relative" shall include a spouse, parent, child, brother, sister, including biological, adopted, foster, step or other legal relation and the spouse of the foregoing, or a domestic partner. However, no incumbent director shall lose eligibility to remain a director or to be re-elected as a director if he becomes a close relative of another incumbent director or of a Cooperative employee because of a marriage to which he was not a party; neither shall an employee lose eligibility to continue in the employment of the Cooperative if he or she becomes a close relative of a director because of marriage to which he or she was not a party.

4. Is at least 21 years of age.

- 5. Has not been convicted of a misdemeanor involving moral turpitude or a felony pursuant to state or federal laws.
- 6. Has been a member for not less than one year.

#### Section 4.4 Nominations

- It shall be the duty of the Board to appoint, in the month of June each year beginning June 2021, a committee on nominations consisting of not less than five (5) nor more than eleven (11) members who shall be selected from different geographic areas so as to ensure equitable representation.
- The committee shall meet on or before August 15 of each year, deliberate, prepare and post at the principal office
  of the corporation a list of nominations for board members which shall include as many nominees for each board
  position as the committee deems desirable.
- Any one hundred (100) or more active members, acting together may make a nomination for a director by petition
  and the secretary shall post such nominations at the same place where the list of nominations made by the
  committee is posted.
- The secretary of the cooperative shall be responsible for mailing with the Notice of the Meeting, or separately, at least twenty (20) days before the date of the meeting, a statement of the number of board members to be elected, the names and addresses of the candidates nominated by the committee on nominations and those nominated by petition.
- Ballots shall list the candidates by geographic areas, in alphabetical order by last name, and shall also designate the
  candidates nominated by the committee and those nominated by petition.

The Nominating Committee will meet at 2 p.m. Tuesday, August 4, at SkyLine's Corporate Offices. \*For the 2020 Annual Meeting, the Nominating Committee was appointed in July.

#### Recipe of the Month

#### Gloria's Creamy Slaw

#### Ingredients:

- 8 cups of grated green cabbage (food processor works best)
- 1 cup of mayonnaise
- 1 cup of sour cream
- 1/3 cup sugar or sugar substitute like Splenda
- 1 to 2 teaspoons apple cider vinegar
- 1 1/2 teaspoons of celery seed
- 1 Tablespoon dried chives
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon lemon pepper

#### Instructions:

Shred cabbage. Blend together all other ingredients, stirring well. Mix sauce with cabbage. Can be made ahead.

Option: For pineapple slaw, add 20 ounces of well drained and pressed down crushed pineapple.
