## SkyLine to Host Bloodmobile at Corporate Campus February 19

SkyLine begins its second year of hosting two blood drives annually for the American Red Cross, with our first one scheduled for Wednesday, February 19, on the main

corporate campus in West Jefferson (1200 NC Highway 194 North). Signs will direct public donors to the lower parking lot and lower entrance to our

engineering building. The blood drive will be held from noon to 4:30 p.m. with several Red Cross staff as well as volunteers on hand to register, and refreshments will be provided.

The Red Cross needs to collect more than 13,000 blood donations and more than 2,500 platelet donations each day. The blood collected by the Red Cross helps millions of patients in over 2,500 hospitals and other facilities across the country. Eighty-four percent of blood donations are given at blood drives – hosted by generous sponsoring organizations like ours. And blood collections received here will go to assist our local hospital.

### 2020 Frank James–SkyLine Scholarship

Ten scholarships with a total value of \$25,000 are scheduled to be awarded this spring to children of SkyLine and SkyBest telephone service customers to assist them with the cost of a college education.

Five \$1,000 scholarships, renewable up to four years, will be awarded to students who will attend a four-year college or university. Five \$500 scholarships, renewable up to two years, will be presented to students who will attend a two-year community/technical college.

The Frank James-SkyLine Scholarship was established by the Board of Directors in 1987 and is named in memory of Frank James, longtime SkyLine board member and former president, who was a strong advocate of education, having served as a teacher, principal and later superintendent of Ashe County Schools.

To qualify, applicants must be children of current SkyLine or SkyBest telephone service customers (of at least one year), and be graduating high school seniors (including home-schooled students) in the co-op's fivecounty service area (Alleghany, Ashe, Avery, Watauga and Johnson). The scholarships will be awarded on the basis of scholastic achievement, financial need, demonstrated leadership and community involvement.

Application packages will be available at area high school guidance departments and all SkyLine Customer Service Centers beginning Thursday, February 6. The deadline for this local scholarship is Friday, March 13.

TELEWORKING CONTINUED FROM PAGE 1 is part of a three-year, sixforum series, with this topic culminating in a two-day event February 10 and 11 at N.C. State University.

According to the latest telecommunicating trend data from Global Workplace Analytics (August 2019), 4.7 million employees (3.4 percent of the

workforce) now work from home at least half the time. While teleworking is not a one-size-fits-all approach, it is proving to be quite effective even in rural areas.

At age 27, Michigan native Zach Barricklow cofounded Versado Training with his siblings to provide custom learning solutions for the life sciences industry. In its first seven years, Versado grew to 30 employees and 100 contractors spread across seven time zones.

With national recognition as one of Inc.'s 5000 Fastest Growing Private Companies, Versado is based in Raleigh, but Barricklow often works remotely from his home in Alleghany County. Having access to highspeed broadband has made all the difference.

"There is absolutely no doubt that this wouldn't have been possible without SkyLine's fiber network in place," Barricklow said. "From utilizing the internet connection for VoIP, web conferencing and dealing with thousands of documents before cloud storage became available, I could rely on the service here."

His role at Versado shifted in recent years to focus on the company's nonprofit arm, Versado Foundation, and he has been actively engaged with initiatives to benefit the county, including consulting Wilkes Community College (WCC) on its five-year strategic plan.

His work with WCC further fed his passion to make a positive difference through community development. Because WCC serves everybody, Barricklow said he has "fallen in love with the community college. I see it as a significant tool for the betterment of our communities and neighbors." As WCC's new Vice President for Strategy, Barricklow maintains an office in Sparta, where he still works remotely at least two days a week.

According to the FRS, more than two-thirds of rural Americans with postsecondary degrees never return to their rural communities, so this program gives particular emphasis to those students who plan to return to their community following college. Eligibility requirements include the following:

 Applicants must be graduating high school seniors and reside full-time with their parent(s) in the companies' service area. Recipe of the Month Nancy's Pond Mountain Great Biscuits

#### Ingredients:

- 3 1/4 cups self-rising flour
- 3 teaspoons baking powder
- 2 teaspoons powdered sugar
- 1/2 cup solid Crisco
- 2 cups sour cream

#### Instructions:

Mix together flour, baking powder and sugar. Cut in Crisco. Blend in sour cream. Turn out on lightly floured surface, make into a ball and pat or roll out, cut with biscuit cutter. Bake at 450° for 10 to 12 minutes for delicious biscuits!
