## **FRS Scholarship Program Deadline Approaches**

SkyLine Membership Corporation is proud to be a local sponsor of the 2016 Foundation for Rural Service (FRS) Scholarship Program. FRS was established in 1994 by the National Telecommunications Cooperative Association (NTCA), of which SkyLine is a member. The FRS promotes, educates and advocates rural telecom issues in order to sustain and enhance the quality of life within communities throughout rural America. Through its various programs and initiatives, the foundation strongly supports the continuing education of rural youth.

This year, 30 one-time, \$2,500 scholarships will be awarded to rural high school seniors: one per geographic region of the NTCA membership and one to a student sponsored by a NTCA associate member. The remaining 19 awards will be distributed proportionate to the number of applications received per region. FRS will fund \$2,000 of each scholarship, with the sponsoring cooperative of each winning student providing a \$500 match.

Additional scholarships to be awarded through this program include the following:

- Four \$5,000 FRS Staurulakis Family Scholarships. Students who are majoring in math, science, engineering or medicine will be given preference.
- Two TMS Scholarships, worth \$1,500 each.

## Reminder: Don't Forget to Start Dialing 10 Digits for Local Calls in 336 Area

To ensure a continuing supply of telephone numbers, the new 743 area code has been added to the area served by 336. Because this is an area code overlay, ALL callers in the 336/743 geographic region must dial 10



digits for local area calls. The new 743 area code serves the same geographic area currently served by

the existing 336 area code, which includes Alleghany and Ashe counties in SkyLine's service area.

The new area code went into effect on October 24, 2015, so you should begin using the new dialing procedures whenever you place a call from the 336 area code. If you forget and dial just seven digits, we are currently in the temporary grace period, which allows seven or 10-digit dialing for local calls, and your call will still be completed. However, beginning April 23, mandatory 10-digit dialing begins in the 336/743 calling area.

#### What will you need to do?

REMEMBER: In addition to changing your dialing procedures, all services, automatic dialing equipment, or other types of equipment that are programmed with a seven-digit number will need to be re-programmed to use the new dialing procedures prior to April 23, 2016. Some examples are life safety systems, PBXs, mobile phone contact lists, fax machines, Internet dial-up numbers, alarm and security systems, gates, speed dialers, call forwarding settings, voicemail services, etc. You may also want to check your business stationery, website, or advertising materials, and your pet's or your personal ID tags to ensure the area code is included.

#### What will remain the same?

- Your telephone number, including current area code, will not change.
- The price of a call, coverage area, or other rates and services will not change due to the overlay.
- What is a local call now will remain a local call regardless of the number of digits dialed.
- You can still dial just three digits to reach 911.
- If 211, 311, 411, 511, 611, 711 or 811 are currently available in your community, you will still dial these codes with just three digits.

# Avery & Watauga Counties Continue with Seven-Digit Dialing for Local & Regional Calls

The new 10-digit dialing pattern WILL NOT affect SkyLine/SkyBest customers in the 828 area code, which includes Avery and Watauga counties. In these two counties, callers may continue to use seven-digit dialing for local and Regional Caller calls. If you have any questions about Regional Caller and the new Area Code, please call your local SkyLine/SkyBest Customer Center at 118 or 1-800-759-2226.

Beginning May 23, 2016, new telephone lines or services may be assigned numbers using the new 743 area code. Existing numbers will not be changed.

Completed applications must be submitted to SkyLine's corporate offices by Friday, February 12. All applicants must be sponsored by SkyLine, and completed applications received by this deadline will be endorsed by a SkyLine official and submitted to the FRS for consideration by the March 1 postmark deadline.

If any SkyLine-sponsored students are named winners, they will be announced in May, in conjunction with area high school awards day programs. For the past few years, there have been winners of this scholarship from our area, so we encourage graduating high school seniors to apply again this year.

#### Recipe of the Month

# **Black Bean Soup for Two**

#### Ingredients:

1/4 cup chopped onion

2 garlic cloves, minced

1 tablespoon olive oil

and drained

1 teaspoon ground cumin

1 teaspoon dried oregano

1/2 teaspoon chili powder 1 (15 oz. can) tomato sauce

1 (15 oz. can) black beans, rinsed

1 (14 oz. can) vegetable or beef broth

1 to 2 tablespoons lime juice 1/8 teaspoon hot pepper sauce Pepper to taste

#### Instructions:

In a large saucepan, sauté onion and garlic in oil until tender. Stir in the cumin, oregano and chili powder; sauté 2 minutes longer. Add tomato sauce, beans, broth and bay leaf. Bring to boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 45 minutes. Stir in lime juice; simmer 10-15 minutes longer. Discard bay leaf. Add pepper sauce and pepper.
