SkyLine/SkyBest Recognized at Ashe Mountain Times' "Best of the Best" Awards Event

At the annual "Best of the Best" Awards Program, presented by the Ashe Mountain Times, SkyLine/SkyBest was recognized as "Best of the Best" in three service categories. The luncheon event at West Jefferson United Methodist Church's Hensley Hall on January 25 attracted nearly 200 honorees and guests to celebrate the best businesses and individuals Ashe County has to offer.

In the categories of "Best Internet Service," "Best Telephone Service" and "Best Cable Service," SkyLine/SkyBest received top honors.

Through October and November of 2015, readers submitted completed ballots for businesses in more than 150 categories, including best restaurant food, accountant, car dealer, furniture store and insurance agency, just to name a few. SkyLine/SkyBest was among the three presenting sponsors of this year's event.

2016 Frank James–SkyLine Scholarship

Ten scholarships with a total value of \$25,000 are scheduled to be awarded this spring to children of SkyLine and SkyBest telephone service customers to assist them with the cost of a college education. Five \$1,000 scholarships, renewable up to four years, will be awarded to students who will attend a four-year college or university. Five \$500 scholarships, renewable up to two years, will be presented to students who will attend a two-year community/technical college.

The Frank James-SkyLine Scholarship was established by the Board of Directors in 1987 and is named in memory of Frank James, a former SkyLine board president and Superintendent of Ashe County Schools.

The scholarships will be awarded on the basis of scholastic achievement, financial need, demonstrated leadership and community involvement. Application packages with eligibility requirements information will be available at area high school guidance departments and all SkyLine/SkyBest Customer Centers beginning Tuesday, March 8.

Remember to Use 10-Digit Dialing for Local Calls in 336/743 Area

To ensure a continuing supply of telephone numbers, the new 743 area code has been added to the area served by 336. This is known as an area code overlay, and it comes with a change in the way you dial local calls. The Area Code change doesn't require you to change your existing area code or telephone number – but it does require you to dial 10 digits for local area calls.



The affected area includes Ashe and Alleghany counties in addition to the Piedmont area including High Point, North Wilkes-

boro, Winston-Salem, Greensboro and Asheboro.

To complete local calls, dial area code + telephone number. This means that all calls in the 336 area code that are currently dialed with seven digits will need to be dialed using area code + telephone number. IMPORTANT: If you dial 1+, you will be charged for a long-distance call. Ten-digit dialing only includes the three-digit area code + seven-digit phone number.

To get accustomed to the new arrangement, we encourage our customers in Alleghany and Ashe to begin using 10-digit dialing when they place a call from the 336 area code. If you forget to use 10 digits for now, your call will still be completed. However, if you don't use the new dialing procedures beginning **April 23, 2016**, your calls won't be completed.

FRS Youth Tour to Washington, D.C.

Again this year, SkyLine will sponsor two high school juniors to be among over 100 students to attend the Foundation for Rural Service's 2016 Youth Tour to Washington, D.C.

Now in its 22nd year, the FRS Tour brings rural students from across the United States to Washington, D.C. for a four-day visit from June 4 through 8 to some of the most historical sites in the nation. While here, students also learn about the telecommunications industry, as well as the regulatory and legislative processes. Educational sessions on these topics are greatly enhanced by both site visits to the U.S. Capitol and the U.S. Department of Agriculture, in addition to meetings with industry leaders and members of Congress.

The students also are given ample time to explore the Nation's Capital and its many attractions. While here, the group visits such sites as the Lincoln and Jefferson Memorials; the Korean, Vietnam and new World War II Memorials; Mount Vernon, home of George Washington; the Smithsonian Museums; and much more.

Recipe of the Month Alan Jackson Chocolate Cake

Ingredients:

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup water
- 1 cup Parkay (70%) Vegetable Oil spread, divided
- 1 cup vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa, divided
- 1/2 cup buttermilk
- 2 eggs
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 teaspoons vanilla, divided
- 1 teaspoon vinegar cider
- 6 tablespoons milk

1 (16 oz) package powdered sugar

Instructions:

In large bowl sift together flour, sugar and salt.

In saucepan, over medium-high heat, heat water, Parkay spread, oil and cocoa to a boil, stirring constantly. Pour into flour mixture, stirring until smooth. Blend buttermilk, eggs, baking soda, vanilla and vinegar until smooth.

Pour into greased & floured 13x9x2inch pan. Bake at 350° for 35 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean. Cool completely in pan on wire rack.

lcing:

In saucepan, over medium-high heat, heat milk, remaining vegetable spread and cocoa to a boil. Remove from heat; stir in powdered sugar and vanilla until smooth. Immediately pour over cooled cake. Cool completely. Submitted by Rondal Sturgill of Ashe County
