# Blevins Recognized with Management Innovation Award at NTCA Annual Meeting

NTCA–The Rural Broadband Association recognized rural telecommunications providers during the Rural Telecom Industry Meeting & EXPO in Lake Buena Vista, Fla., in late February, for their achievements and service to the telecommunications industry, and SkyLine Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Jimmy Blevins was among the honorees.

Seven individuals received individual achievement awards, and Blevins was recognized with the "Management Innovation Award." Blevins received the award for his ongoing efforts to make innovative changes to diversify the company's revenue opportunities and place the focus on the needs of the customer.

After assuming the role of SkyLine CEO in July 2008, Blevins immediately began making innovative changes, some of which were subtle operational changes while others were more globally minded and customer-focused, such as the deployment of a Smart Home, creation of The Video Exchange and several unique service offerings. Blevins is an engineer by education. Prior to his current role, he led the company's Engineering and Plant Operations for several years and was the architect of SkyLine's present network. Below is a summary of Blevins' innovative achievements that were recognized by NTCA.

#### Smart Home

Home" on commercial property that had been purchased by SkyLine to construct a new Retail Center. The Smart Home in West Jefferson is a full-service telecommunications retail center that gives customers a real-time look at innovative Smart Home features, enabled through SkyBest's broadband, automation and surveillance services.

## Weekender Internet

Blevins developed a 'Weekender Internet' service offering for part-time residents who wanted Internet during their weekend visits to their mountain homes but felt there was not enough value in paying for an entire month's service.

#### **One-to-One Initiative**

Working collaboratively with Alleghany County's Superintendent of Schools, Blevins addressed a need relating to its 'one-to-one initiative,' where high school students received a laptop but due to low income, could not afford Internet access at home. Realizing the school's Internet backhaul was not being utilized at night, Blevins devised a solution for the school to purchase circuits through SkyLine to connect to the students' homes and tie back into the school's IT network. In 2012, this school was one of 10 schools/districts in the state recognized by the N.C. Governor with the "Innovator in Digital Learning" award.

## The Video Exchange

After SkyLine deployed a local content channel as part of its TV service line-up, Blevins approached his peers in the rural telecom industry regarding the need for additional content and found that some companies had ample content while others needed content. To satisfy a need on both sides of the content equation, he developed the concept for an eCommerce site and a new subsidiary of SkyBest called "The Video Exchange," where companies can purchase or sell video content.

NTCA's national awards are voted on by the association's Awards Committee, which is composed of NTCA members. NTCA Chief Executive Officer Shirley Bloomfield presented the awards during the Rural Telecom Industry Meeting & EXPO Awards Banquet on February 24.
