SkyLine will continue its fifth annual breakfast food drive for area food pantries through this month in conjunction with our statewide cooperative association, the Co-op Council of N.C.

SkyLine and other co-ops are organizing food drives as part of celebrating National Cooperative Month in October, and we have a special incentive to encourage our members/customers to join in this effort. While supplies last, visit any of our customer service locations to pick up a "Rise & Shine to Fight Hunger" grocery tote, and we invite you to use this tote to fill it with non-perishable breakfast items for the food drive. A list of suggested nonperishable items is featured on page 2.

After you drop off the items to SkyLine, keep the grocery tote for yourself, and SkyLine will deliver the items to area food pantries, including the Solid Rock Food Closet, Ashe County Sharing Center Pantries, Second Harvest Food Bank of Northeast Tennessee Mobile Food Pantry (Shady Valley Baptist Church), the Hunger and Health Coalition and Reaching Avery Ministry.

These organizations report that breakfast items are among the most needed but in shortest supply on pantry shelves. While one in six people living in this region struggles with hunger, the situation is even worse among

Best Ever Pancakes

Ingredients:

- 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons of sugar
- 1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 2 1/4 cups buttermilk
- 2 large eggs
- 1/4 cup of butter, melted

Instructions:

Combine flour, sugar, baking powder, baking soda and salt in large bowl. Stir together buttermilk and eggs. Gradually stir buttermilk mixture into flour. Gently stir in melted butter. Pour about 1/4 cup of batter for each pancake onto nonstick skillet. Cook about 3 or 4 minutes, turn and cook 3 or 4 more minutes.
