role of member-owned cooperatives. All students who attend Co-op Leadership Camp are eligible for the Jim Graham \$1,000 college scholarship, which they apply for their senior year of high school.

The Cooperative Leadership Camp, hosted by the Cooperative Council of North Carolina, is an educational program for rising high school sophomores through seniors in NC. The five-day resident camping program takes place in White Lake, NC and features interactive workshops and presentations, team-building activities and recreation. The camp program includes the organization of a T-shirt cooperative, including an election of a board of directors, and selection of a manager. CCNC Member Cooperatives are invited to sponsor a high school teen from their community and allow them to have this opportunity cost-free. Students from across the state come together and learn about how Cooperatives are functioning in our state. Across all industries, cooperatives provide a solution to problems and this leadership camp allows teens to see that first hand.

## **Buttermilk Pound Cake**

#### Ingredients:

- 1 1/2 cups (3 sticks) butter, softened
- 2 1/2 cups white sugar
- 4 eggs
- 1 cup buttermilk
- 1/2 teaspoon baking soda
- 3 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 2 teaspoons lemon extract
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

#### Instructions:

Preheat oven to 325 degrees. Grease and flour a 10- inch tube pan. In a large mixing bowl, cream together butter and sugar for 5 minutes. Add eggs, one at a time, beating just until mixed into butter mixture. In a small bowl, combine buttermilk and baking soda. Combine flour and salt. Alternately add butter/milk mixture and flour mixture, beginning and ending with the flour mixture. Stir in lemon and vanilla extracts. Pour into prepared pan.

Bake for 1 hour and 15 minutes or until tester inserted into center comes out clean. Cool in pan on wire rack for 15 minutes. Remove from pan and cool completely on wire rack.

NOTE: Best served with whipped cream and sliced strawberries!
